## English

Students will be exploring both the narrative and persuasive genres during Term One. They will write a story about friendship, using appropriate grammatical conventions and narrative structure. Students will develop their comprehension strategies by analysing a range of narratives and focusing on implied meaning and vocabulary. During the persuasive unit, students will read and respond to advertisements, articles and ideas, while identifying persuasive language techniques. When writing, students will be expected to communicate their point of view concisely, within one paragraph, and incorporate appropriate grammar, punctuation and persuasive techniques.

## Math

Students will be recognising, representing and ordering three digit numbers. They will continue to develop their understanding of addition and subtraction by utilising a range of skills and strategies. They will be conducting, analyzing and reporting on chance experiments and learning about the formal units for measuring length.

## Homework

Information will be sent home within the first week back at school regarding homework. Expectations will include reading and some revision of English and Math concepts.

## Before and After School

**Before school**, children are expected to wait under A block until the first bell rings at 8:45am. Please remind your child to go directly to A block and not walk around the school grounds or go on the playgrounds before school.

**After school**, please arrange a meeting place with your child and utilise the drop off/pick up areas. Due to COVID restrictions parents will not be able to enter the grounds to meet their child.

## Science and HASS (Thursday)

### Science

Students will examine living and non-living things within their environment. They will develop their understanding of the scientific method by making predictions and measuring outcomes by collecting data and analysing trends and relationships.

### HASS (Humanities and Social Sciences)

Students will learn about unique aspects of their own and other communities. They will learn about important events, celebrations and commemorations and will understand how people participate and contribute to their communities.

## Health

Students will explore the topic of friendship. They will determine important qualities they value in a friend as well as learning the different roles and responsibilities of friendship. Students will understand the importance of respectful communication when resolving conflicts.
